RIVER VER AND LAKES IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

St Albans District Council is working with partners to develop a plan that will improve the river and explore opportunities to enhance the wider river area through the city.

We want to improve the River Ver in St Albans to create a better environment for people and wildlife.

The council is currently investigating possible solutions to resolve the issues surrounding the river and lakes, while exploring other opportunities to create a better place for people and wildlife.

As part of this, we'd like to hear your thoughts. You can have your say by filling in the online comments form. Possible solutions must be feasible, sustainable and provide value for money.

Over the last 2000 years the River Ver in St Albans has been altered for industry, flood risk reduction, amenity and recreation, which have restricted river habitats and wildlife.

The ornamental lakes in Verulamium Park are fed by the river and suffer from poor water quality. This and other contributory factors cause algal blooms and reduced oxygen levels in the water, which is detrimental to wildlife.

ANNE TACKLES ROHINGYA CRISIS

After returning from visiting the Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh, Anne Main MP has been working tirelessly to bring attention to this issue in parliament.

Anne secured a debate to share stories from the camps and urged the Minister to do everything possible to help support those affected by this crisis. This pressure has resulted in the government committing £47m in British aid, and a further

\$300m in the international aid effort.

Anne said, 'long term we need a political solution, but I'm delighted that the aid effort has been stepped up.' Mrs Main has been working with the Disaster and Emergency Committee for their appeal for the Rohingya refugees.
